The City of Encinitas is pleased to support SB 1234 (Allen), which would allow local governments to adopt non-substantive modifications on a land use plan (LUP) of a local coastal program (LCP) or any zoning ordinance and district map changes through a ministerial approval process.

The California Coastal Commission (Commission) can delegate permitting authority to the cities and counties if the local governments develop and receive certification of Local Coastal Programs (LCPs). The California Coastal Act requires a LUP, an implementation plan, and zoning ordinances or district maps to be submitted, reviewed, and certified by the Commission. The Commission can suggest amendments, and if the local government accepts them, the plan is considered approved.

This process is often time-consuming and can lead to delays in crucial coastal development and other projects in the coastal zone. This bill would allow the city or county legislative bodies to authorize planning directors to adopt non-substantive changes to local land use plans and zoning ordinances or district maps through ministerial approval if the ministerial process is adopted through a public meeting and by resolution or ordinance. Allowing local governments to use ministerial approval for non-substantive modifications to the LUP or zoning ordinances and district maps would streamline the process for municipalities to adopt changes while ensuring compliance with the California Coastal Act.
