Redistricting Rules and Goals

1. Federal Laws

Equal Population
Federal Voting Rights Act
No Racial Gerrymandering



2. California Criteria for Cities

- 1. Geographically contiguous
- 2. Undivided neighborhoods and "communities of interest" (Socio-economic geographic areas that should be kept together)
- 3. Easily identifiable boundaries
- 4. Compact

(Do not bypass one group of people to get to a more distant group of people)

Prohibited:

"Shall not favor or discriminate against a political party."

3. Other Traditional Redistricting Principles

Minimize voters shifted to different election years

Respect voters' choices / continuity in office

Future population growth

Preserving the core of existing districts



Month(s)	Event
Initial Public Workshop August 16	Provide introduction of redistricting process to the public Do initial online mapping tool demo
Census Data Release August 12	Census Bureau releases official 2020 Census population data
Public Hearing #1 September 22	Education about the process and communities of interest Initial public testimony about communities of interest
California Data Release Late September	California releases official "prisoner adjusted" redistricting data
Public Mapping Workshop October 16	Workshop to allow members of the public to view and use mapping tools Demos of mapping tools
Public Hearing #2 November 17	Continue education about process and solicit feedback on communities of interest; hear public testimony about existing map and communities
Public Hearing #3 January 19	Discuss and review draft maps Solicit feedback from the public about draft maps
Public Hearing #4 March 9	Revised maps posted online and available at Encinitas City Hall Discuss, revise and adopt recommended final map and discuss election sequence
April 17, 2022	(Election Minus 205) Statutory deadline to adopt map ordinance

District 4: -382


Total Deviation +9.69%






Maps Keeping General Structure





















Maps moving north section of New Encinitas to eastern district and south Olivenhain to coastal district





Maps moving north section of New Encinitas to eastern district and south Olivenhain to coastal district









Maps moving part of the north section of New Encinitas to eastern district and keeping Olivenhain






Maps moving north section of New Encinitas to eastern district and south Olivenhain to coastal district







Maps moving north section of New Encinitas to eastern district and south Olivenhain to coastal district





Maps keeping north section of New Encinitas in coastal district







Maps Changing Number of Coast Districts





Single Coast District Maps


Maps focused on a single unified coastal district


