The City of Encinitas opposes both AB 726 (Holden) and AB 813 (Holden).

Tasha Boerner Horvath Council Member While the City of Encinitas continues to explore the possibility of a Community Choice Aggregation (CCA), the City has not made a final determination on this issue. As a result, we oppose any legislation that would limit a local government's ability to determine if a CCA is the best option for their residents. The City has worked on the CCA issue for the past two and a half years by having agenda reports, a Council ad hoc subcommittee, public hearings and expert testimony on the subject.

Mark Muir Council Member Community Choice Aggregation energy programs help California achieve a carbon-free electricity future by empowering local and regional action on climate change. This gives local government a hand in choosing the mix of the type of electrical energy sources they want, specifically to address greenhouse gas reduction. The State of California is a leader in addressing greenhouse gas reduction, and local governments in California should not be frozen out of making decisions that follow this State policy direction. As partners with the State in achieving policy goals, the operating CCA programs across California currently have an average renewables content of 50% in 2017—achieving State mandates over a decade early. Not all regions or jurisdictions will choose CCAs, but it should remain a local choice.

Karen P. Brust City Manager We oppose AB 726, because it would freeze the implementation of CCAs, and this would provide an impediment to our City. We oppose AB 813, which would require the Investor Owned Utilities (IOUs) to sign new renewable energy contracts while passing on the costs of this procurement to CCA customers. Mandating IOU procurement of renewable energy is unnecessary; the market is evolving without such mandates. For these reasons, the City of Encinitas is opposed to AB 726 & AB 813.
