Lori spoke about an ongoing dispute over a large Monterey Cypress tree on her property that is a boundary tree with a new development being built. Lori had previously applied for heritage tree status, but the application was blocked legally by the developer. Lori asked UFAC if the City's Administrative Manual also applied to privately owned trees. City arborist Kallstrand confirmed that at this time, the Manual only applies to City owned and maintained trees.

2. TREE TOPPING ON RANCHO SANTA FE ROAD

SPEAKERS:

City arborist Kallstrand presented a power point presentation regarding the topping of city owned trees along Rancho Santa Fe Road and Morning Sun Drive. There were around ten (10) or more Red Gum Eucalyptus that were topped. The average per tree value of this cluster of Red Gum Eucalyptus is \$3,079.00. City arborist Kallstrand is currently gathering information and believes that there is enough evidence to pursue cost recovery through the City's ordinance. Once evidence is compiled, it will be shared with City staff and the Code Enforcement Division. It is the arborist's professional opinion that the trees are not able to be fully salvaged after the way they were topped.
